In the first few pages of the guide Dan mentions some FREE websites where you can take practice tests, it really doesn't matter which one you use, they are all taken from the question pool. Once you are through the guide, use these sites to help you study for the real thing.

We will start promptly at 8:30am and go through the entire guide. We will take about a 10 minute break in the morning, a 30 minute break for lunch, and another 10 minute break in the afternoon. This a pretty intense session so prepare yourself for a full day, I would bring a light lunch. When we have completed the class work the IDHS VE team will conduct an exam session. The exam is 35 questions, pass/fail and will be graded on-site. You will know if you have passed or failed before you leave. You should expect to receive an email from the FCC the following week that will explain how you can pay your license fee so there

is no need to bring any fees with you to this class. Once you have paid your fees the FCC will issue you your callsign.

What you should bring to the exam session:

 Some form of government issued photo ID(typically a drivers license, passport, state issued ID)

If no photo ID is available, two forms of identification:

- a. non-photo ID/driver's license (some states still have them)
- b. birth certificate (must have the appropriate seal)
- c. social security card
- d. library card
- e. utility bill, bank statement or other business correspondence that specifically names the person; or a postmarked envelope addressed to the person at his or her current mailing address as it appears on the Form 605. Students may bring any of the above items and/or a school ID, minor's work permit, report card, or a legal guardian may present a photo ID. If applicable, bring either the original and a photocopy of your current Amateur Radio license, or the original(s) and photocopy(s) of any Certificates of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCE) you may hold from previous exam sessions. If your license has already been issued by FCC, the CSCE showing license credit is not needed. The photocopy(s) will not be returned.
- A simple calculator(add, subtract, multiply and divide) with the memory erased, I have some to loan if needed. You may not bring any written notes or calculations into the exam session. Slide rules and logarithmic tables are acceptable, as long as they're free of notes and formulas. Cell phone must be silenced or turned off during the exam session and the phones' calculator function may not be used. In addition, iPhones, iPads, Androids, smartphones, Blackberry devices and all similar electronic devices with a calculator capability, may NOT be used.
- A couple of #2 pencils(again I do have a few pencils if needed)
